## **COVID-19 Booster Dose Recommendations**

As of November 30, 2021 in Washington, 26,548 COVID-19 cases and 3,167 deaths (34 percent of total deaths) are associated with a long-term care facility.

Booster doses of all three COVID-19 vaccine types are now available for everyone 18 and older.

- Everyone 18 and older should get a booster shot at least six months after receiving both doses of the Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna COVID-19 vaccine.
- Everyone 18 and older who received the single-dose Johnson & Johnson vaccine should get a booster shot two months after getting vaccinated.

## **How to Access Support for Booster Doses**

Resources are available to help ensure vaccinations can be done at your facility. Consider the following for planning and accessing COVID-19 vaccines:

- 1. Contact your long-term care pharmacy for on-site support.
