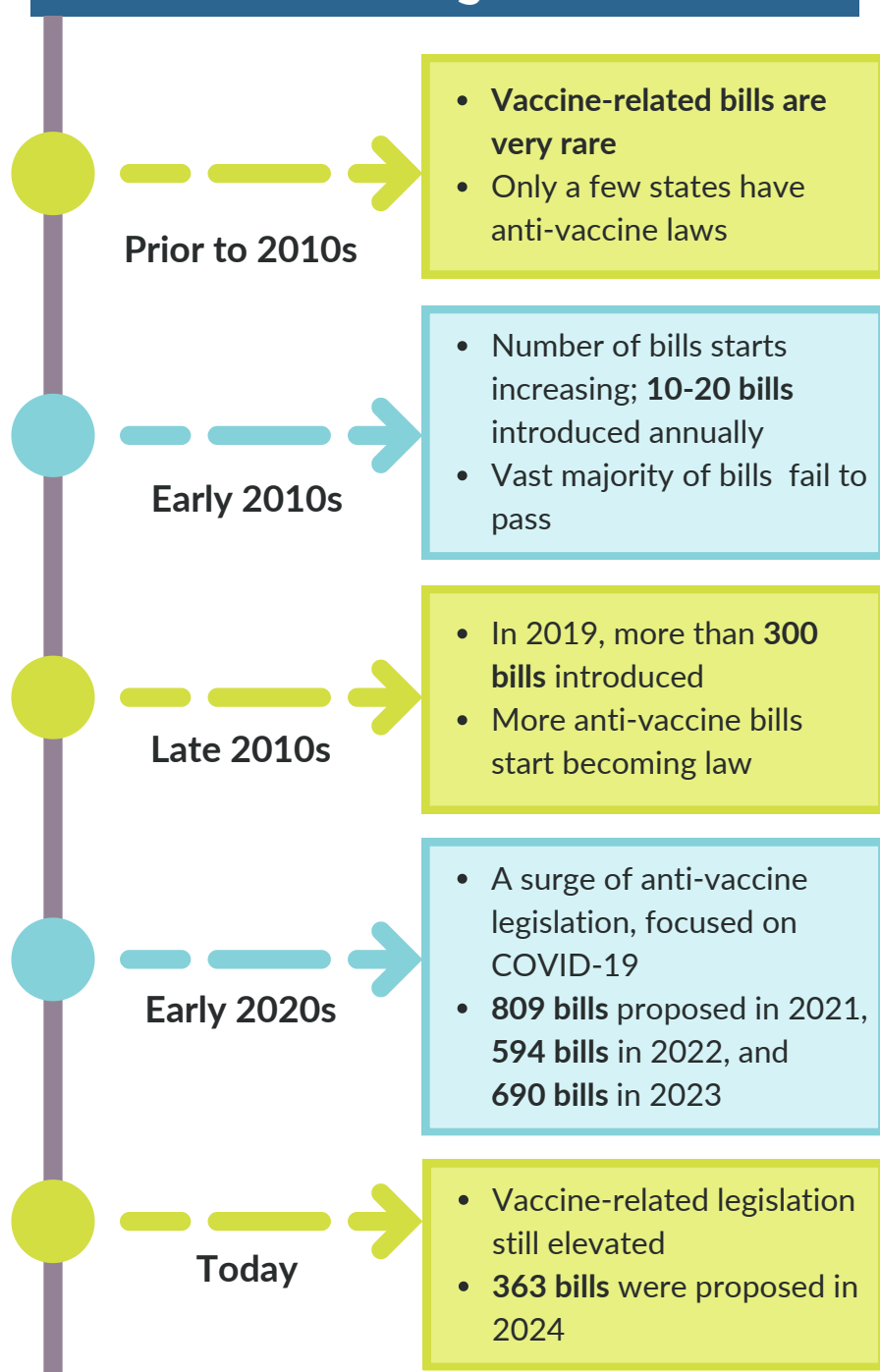


# Support states in navigating VACCINE-RELATED LEGISLATION

Despite 84% of Americans and the scientific consensus supporting vaccination, state legislatures have faced a surge in anti-vaccine bills recently. As this trend intensifies, immunization programs and advocates require urgent investment to effectively analyze and respond to this growing wave of legislation.

(only 1 bill became law)

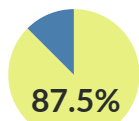
## Current Trend

The COVID-19 pandemic caused vaccine-related legislation to surge

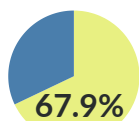


and the amount of legislation hasn't returned to pre-pandemic levels

## Major Priority for Immunization Programs

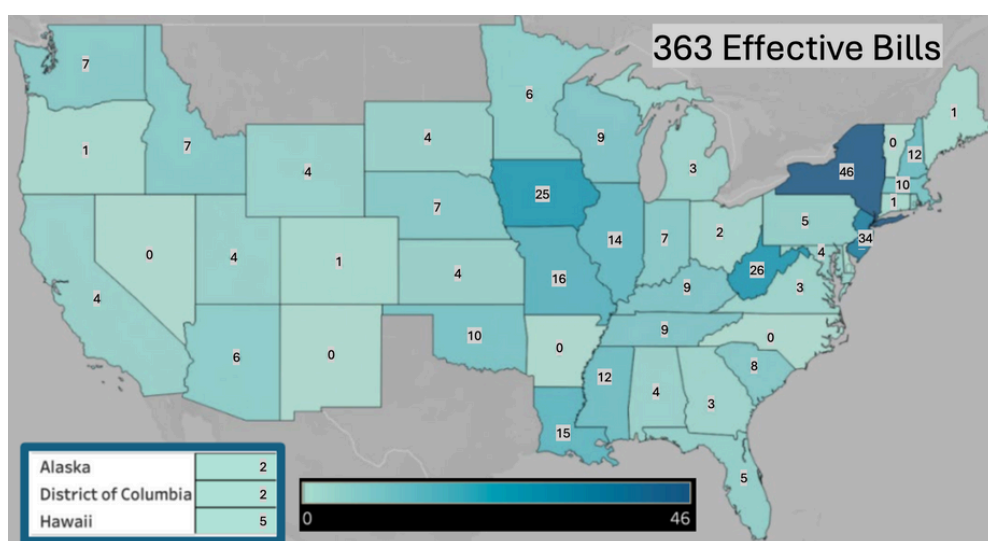


reported having to address vaccine hesitancy with state legislatures

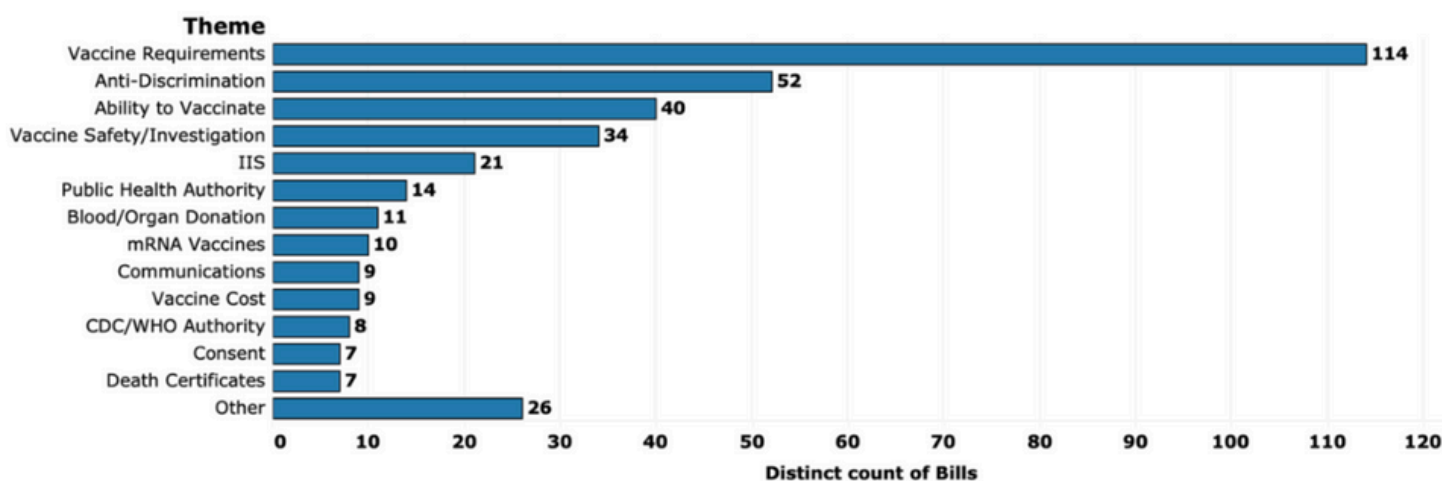


reported managing political landscape was a moderate to substantial challenge

This infographic includes data from the 2022 Association of Immunization Managers (AIM) Annual Survey. The 2022 AIM Annual Survey was administered online from May-October 2022. The survey was sent to all 64 federally funded state, territorial, and local immunization programs. The response rate was 83%. This infographic also includes data from the Center for Public Health Law Research, the American Journal of Public Health, the American Academy of Pediatrics, and the Association of State and Territorial Health Officials. The 2024 Map and Current Themes were identified and populated using FiscalNote Software.
